Strike halts trains to and from Amsterdam

AMSTERDAM: Train services ground to a near standstill around Amsterdam on Monday as the latest in a series of strikes by railway workers hit the Dutch capital, halting international services and affecting lines to and from the busy Schiphol international airport. Eurostar, the company that runs trains between London and Amsterdam, said its trains would not run to Rotterdam or Amsterdam, and Thalys, whose trains run in France, the Netherlands and Belgium, warned travellers that its services would be disrupted.

Rights group condemns jailing of Tibetan monks

DHARAMSALA: The Tibetan Centre for Human Rights and Democracy (TCHRD) on Monday condemned the sentencing of two monks — Tenzin Dhargay and Rigste — to prison for merely exercising the right to freedom of expression, a right protected in the Chinese constitution as well as in major international human rights instruments that the Beijing government is party to. Dhargay and Rigste are from Sersul County in the Tibetan Autonomous Prefecture. Both had been detained incommunicado for almost two years and sentenced on an unknown date in June this year.



Fire on Baltic Sea ferry put out, no one injured

STOCKHOLM: A fire was reported on Monday on a passenger ferry carrying nearly 300 people from Sweden to Latvia but officials said the blaze — which they described as "limited" — was put out. No one was reported injured. The ferry was north of Sweden's Baltic Sea island of Gotland when the fire broke out. No one was evacuated but one person on the ferry said passengers had gathered on the upper deck.



Vostok 2022 drills will involve 50,000+ troops

MOSCOW: Russia said on Monday that the Vostok 2022 military exercises will be held from September 1 to 7 in different locations in the Far East and the Sea of Japan and involve more than 50,000 troops from China, India and several other countries. "The Vostok 2022 strategic command and staff exercise envisages various scenarios of operations by combined arms and coalition forces (troops) to ensure military security of the Russian Federation and its allies within the area of responsibility of the Eastern Military District," the Russian Defence Ministry was quoted as saying.

'Monster monsoon': Pakistan makes desperate plea for help

The death toll from the devastating floods in Pakistan neared 1,100 on Monday, as international aid began to trickle in following Prime Minister Shehbaz Sharif-led cash-strapped government's desperate appeal for aid to deal with the crisis that has displaced 33 million or one-seventh of the country's population. Pakistan's Climate Change Minister Sherry Rehman called it the "monster monsoon of the decade," while Finance Minister Miftah Ismail said the floods have impacted Pakistan's economy by \$10 billion.

At least 1,061 are dead and 1,575 injured, according to the latest data issued on Monday by the National Disaster Management Authority, the chief national organisation tasked to deal with natural calamities.

It said that about 992,871 houses were totally or partially damaged, leaving millions without access to food, clean drinking water and shelter.

Around 7,19,558 livestock are also dead, as millions of acres of fertile farmlands have been inundated by weeks of constant

rains. Officials said final death toll could be much higher, a grim forecast as thousands of villages in Khyber Pakhtunkhwa province remain cut off from the rest of the country as swollen rivers destroyed roads and bridges, *Express Tribune* newspaper reported.

Pakistan's Energy Ministry said that restoration of power in Sindh and Balochistan provinces

remained top priority. Unable to cope with one of the worst catastrophes, Pakistan sought international help and the world has responded, with humanitarian assistance and solidarity messages coming from several countries.

Citing an aide to Pakistani Prime Minister Sharif, the *BBC* said the country was desperate for international support.

'Can consider importing edibles from India'

Amid food security concerns due to catastrophic floods, Pakistan on Monday said that it can consider importing vegetables and other edible items from India, according to a media report.

Pakistani Finance Minister Miftah Ismail, while talking to media persons, said the country's government "can consider importing vegetables and other edible items from India" for the facilitation of the people in wake of the destruction of standing crops in Pakistan due to recent floods, *Radio Pakistan* reported.

Minister Ismail was speaking to the local media on a range of issues including the devastating floods, the poor state of the Pakistani economy and protests by Imran Khan-led PTI.

Iraqi Shiite cleric to resign; followers storm palace

A hugely influential Shiite cleric announced he would resign from Iraqi politics on Monday and his angry followers stormed the government palace in response, sparking fears that violence could erupt in a country already beset by its worst political crisis in years.

Iraq's government has been deadlocked since cleric Muqtada al-Sadr's party won the largest share of seats in October parliamentary elections but not enough to secure a majority government. He refused to negotiate with Iran-backed Shiite rivals to form a consensus government.

In July, his supporters broke into the parliament to deter al-Sadr's rivals from forming a government and have been staging a sit-in outside the building for over four weeks. His bloc has also resigned from parliament.

This is not the first time al-Sadr, who has called for early elections and the dissolution of parliament, has announced his retirement from politics — and many dismissed the latest move as another bluff to gain greater leverage against his rivals amid a worsening stalemate. The cleric has used the tactic on previous occasions when political developments did not go his way. But many are concerned that it's a risky gambit and are worried how it will impact Iraq's

fragile political climate. On Monday, hundreds pulled down the cement barriers outside the Republican Palace with ropes and breached the palace gates.

Many rushed into the lavish salons and marbled halls of the palace, a key meeting place for Iraqi heads of state and foreign dignitaries.

Iraq's military swiftly announced a city-wide curfew on Monday in the hopes of calming rising tensions and heading off the possibility of clashes.

It called on the cleric's supporters to withdraw immediately from the heavily fortified government zone and to practice self-restraint "to prevent clashes or the spilling of Iraqi blood," according to a statement.

"The security forces affirm their responsibility to protect government institutions, international missions, public and private properties," the statement said. The cleric announced his withdrawal from politics in a tweet, and ordered the closure of his party offices.

Religious and cultural institutions will remain open.

UK aircraft carrier breaks down on way to US

The UK's biggest aircraft carrier, HMS Prince of Wales, has broken down off the south coast of England after setting sail from Portsmouth Naval Base for the US on what the Royal Navy has described as a "landmark" aviation trial mission.

The warship was said to be experiencing an "emerging mechanical issue" and the problem is being investigated. The GBP 3 billion carrier, which became fully operational last year, is reportedly anchored southeast of the Isle of Wight while the investigation is carried out.

"HMS Prince of Wales remains in the South Coast Exercise Area while conducting investigations into an emerging mechanical issue," a Royal

Navy spokesperson said.

The problem was first reported by 'UK Defence Journal', an online news site focused on defence issues, which cited unconfirmed reports about damage to the starboard propeller shaft.

On Saturday, the Royal Navy announced the warship's departure for the US to "shape the future of stealth jet and drone operations" off the coast of North America and in the Caribbean.

"Taking the HMS Prince of Wales task group across the Atlantic for the rest of this year will not only push the boundaries of UK carrier operations, but will reinforce our close working relationship with our closest ally," said Commanding Officer, Captain Richard Hewitt.

2 Air France pilots suspended for mid-air brawl

PARIS: Two Air France pilots were suspended after fighting in the cockpit on a Geneva-Paris flight in June, *New York Post* reported citing an airline official on Sunday. The *New York Post* stated that the pilot and co-pilot had a dispute after takeoff, and grabbed each other by their collars after one apparently hit the other.

Crew was forced to intervene, and one member stayed in the cockpit to babysit the pair for the remainder of the flight to the French capital. French newspaper *La Tribune* reported that the pilot and co-pilot had a dispute shortly after takeoff, and grabbed each other by their collars after one apparently hit the other. Cabin crew intervened and one crew member spent the flight in the cockpit with the pilots, the report said.

News of the fight emerged after France's air investigation agency, BEA, issued a report Wednesday saying that some Air France pilots lack rigor in respecting procedures during safety incidents. It focused on a fuel leak on an Air France flight from Brazzaville in the Republic of Congo to Paris in December 2020, when pilots rerouted the plane but didn't cut power to the engine or land as soon as possible, as leak procedure requires.

New Covid symptoms found in Hong Kong kids

The health experts in Hong Kong have warned of new clinical features including hoarseness and inspiratory stridor (a sign of airway obstruction) among children suffering from Covid during the fifth wave.

The latest development brings concerns for the city, which has reported over 7,000 Covid cases for four consecutive days, as the new school year for primary and secondary schools is set to begin on September 1, as per local media reports.

According to China's *Global Times*, Chuang Shuk-Kwan, director of the Communicable Diseases Division of the Center for Health Protection of the HKSAR Government's Department of Health said that he found some infected children had developed croup, which indicates an inflammation of the larynx, windpipe, and bronchial tubes.

Mike Kwan Yat-wah, the consultant at the department of pediatrics and adolescent medicine at Princess Margaret Hospital, said that the clinical features among children during the fifth wave driven by the Omicron variant differ from those observed in the previous ones. "Its symptoms are hoarseness and inspiratory stridor. In severe cases, it can produce acute obstruction of



the respiratory tract and an absence of oxygen supply to an organ or a tissue," he added. Kwan further said, "This condition can also be caused

by various infectious agents, such as parainfluenza virus. However, in the recent Covid pandemic, this condition was nearly all caused by the Omicron variant."

Tibet's capital cuts off community transmission

Tibet's capital Lhasa has essentially cut off the community transmission of Covid as the autonomous region of China reported 570 cases on Sunday, local authorities said on Monday.

All new cases have been detected in high-risk areas, at designated quarantine sites, or among people under closed management, the office of Lhasa's leading group for fighting Covid said. China's National Health Commission on

Monday reported that the Tibet region has recorded 570 Covid cases. The community spread of the virus was stopped thanks to the arduous prevention and control efforts made by local authorities since the Covid resurgence began on August 7.

The commission said that the Covid prevention and control situation remains complicated, and there could still be risks of hidden transmission as the city has a number of medium or high-risk areas for Covid.
